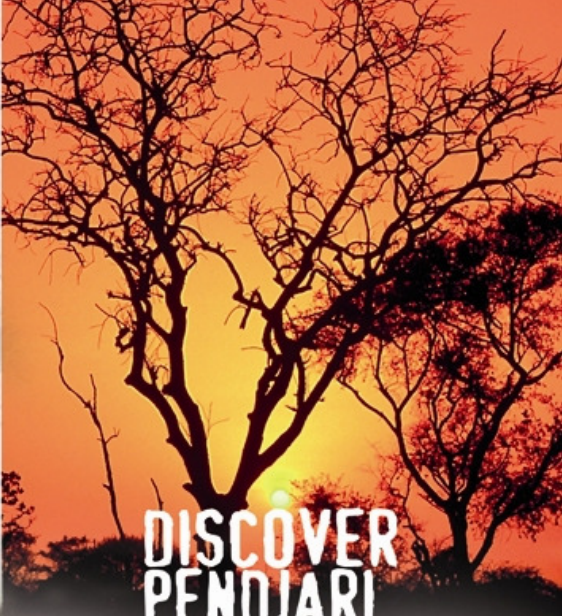


A PURE STATE OF NATURE

The dry season, especially between January and May, is the best time to observe animals. The greatest number of migrating birds is present from December to the end of January. During the rainy season the landscape becomes green once again. Lodging is available at hotels and bush camps. A camping site is expected to be available in 2009.

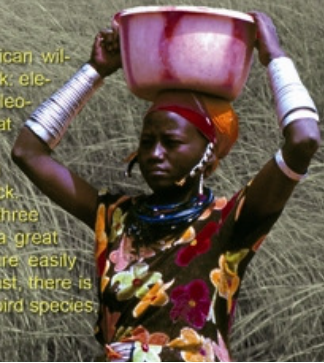


DISCOVER PENDJARI

Open all year round, the Pendjari National Park in the north of Benin is a UNESCO Biosphere Reserve and has the wealthiest diversity of flora and fauna in West Africa.

WILD FAUNA

Four of the "Big Five" African wildlife are present in the Park: elephants, buffalo, lions and leopards. Even species that are rare in Africa such as the cheetah and topi can be observed with some luck. Ten species of antelopes, three species of primates and a great number of hippopotami are easily observed. Last but not least, there is an impressive number of bird species.



WELCOME TO BENIN

Enjoy the warm reception all year round, the ancient culture and an exceptional nature. Pendjari National Park is 630 km from Cotonou, 450 km from Ougadougou (Burkina Faso) and 500 km from Niamey (Niger).

MEET AT PENDJARI

Consolidated roads, hotels and bush camps will facilitate your journey. Enter Pendjari through Bafia, Porga, Ari or Konkombri. The roads within the Park that reach a total of 400 km are passable, preferably with a 4x4 vehicle. During the rainy season, especially from August to mid-October, access to the Park is difficult and it is recommended to enter only through Bafia.
